Treat and prevent head lice

Cases of head lice has been notified to school. While head lice are an annoying problem, it is not a danger to your child's health, so there is no need to panic. When a case has been confirmed, it becomes very important for you to check your family for lice immediately and treat as appropriate. Our local chemist or your GP surgery can give you more advice on how best to treat, or you may wish to look on our school website for further advice. Please know that anyone and everyone can get head lice. In an average school year, more children will "contract" lice than the common cold. If you find any live lice or eggs, it is absolutely necessary to treat each "infected" person, but more importantly, you must notify the school so that we can effectively and confidentially monitor the situation. These outbreaks end much more quickly when there is proper communication between parents and school.
