## CURRICULUM—What your child will be learning

English

#### **PSHE & British Values**

Our theme in Summer is 'Over the Border'. We will mainly be working as geographers and looking at OS maps and working with four and six figure grid references and eight points of a compass. We will identify physical and human features on maps. We will be visiting Wales and developing our fieldwork skills and then analysing our results when we get back to school. Children will learn about renewable energy and make deductions as to why Wales is suitable for renewable energy projects. When working as a historian we will be learning about Edward I and Owain Glyndwr and how they shaped Wales. Children will also understand the purpose of defensive features of castles. Children will also get to work as artists in this theme. They will learn about the prominent Welsh artist Kyffin Williams. Children will then critique his paintings and look at how he portrays mood and atmosphere and how he uses perspective. The children will then create their own scenery paining using thickened paint and palette knives. When on the school trip children will have the opportunity to sketch the castle and then when back in school recreate this on cartridge paper using charcoal.
