Children will be in groups (bubbles) and will not mix with other groups.	School hours will be 8.50am 3.20pm Drop off 8.45 to 9.05 Collect from 3pm to 3.20pm (for now there will be no breakfast or after school club)	For now, parents/carers will not be fined for non attendance.
Children will be dropped off and collected by one parent / carer from different gates and points around the school.	Children travelling to school wearing gloves and face masks will be able to keep these in their bags in the day if they do not wish to wear them in school.	We will continue to provide home learning to your child on seesaw, Twitter and evidence me Seesaw
There will be a daily clean of the school and contact points will be cleaned throughout the school day.	Parents and carers will not be abletobeonsite; onlytodrop off and pick up at set points.	If you have a long journey on public transport, we would encourage you to stay at home for now
Children will be regularly reminded how to wash their hands effectively and there will be frequent hand washing.	Social distancing will be in place wherever possible but it is not deemed necessary by the DfE if other actions listed are taken.	Please inform school if things at home change and you want to return to school. This may take a few days to prepare so we will be in touch when we are ready.
Break and lunch times will be staggered and sections of the playground will be assigned to different groups.	Children will be given a water bottle, with their name on and provided with a lunch for now.	School will continue with online learning at home but the amount may reduce as more children return to school and staffing levels reduce.
All children will have a pack of their own equipment.	If a child in your child's group has symptoms, every child in that group will be asked to self-isolate for 14 days or until they test negative.
